BIBLE EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

MAF CAREER STAFF APPLICANTS ARE REQUIRED TO COMPLETE 12 HOURS OF COLLEGE-LEVEL (OR EQUIVALENT) BIBLE COURSES

MAF recognizes the necessity for Career Staff to have a solid grasp of God's Word so that they are equipped to integrate Scripture into their lives and ministry.

REQUIRED COURSE CONTENT

To meet the requirements for Biblical studies, a course must be clearly focused on the content of the Scriptures. Most Bible courses (typically prefixed with BI or BIB) from accredited Christian colleges or Bible institutes are accepted. While very valuable, counseling and Christian education classes do **NOT** typically count towards the requirement.

- The <u>Perspectives</u> course from the U.S. Center for World Mission is highly recommended and counts for 3 credit hours toward the 12-hour requirement. It can be taken for college credit or for a certificate. Both methods count towards the requirement.

 - Bible Study Fellowship (BSF) or Community Bible Study courses 2 hours
